From Desolation to Hope - School Holy Week Liturgies

Dear St Thomas Aquinas Families,

During this week our school community has re-enacted and participated in the events marking the Passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. On Monday our Kindergarten and Year 1 students

re-enacted and meditated on Christ's joyful entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Later the same day our Years 2 & 3 students marked Jesus' Last Supper with His Apostles. The Lord's Supper was followed by class-based re-enactment of the washing of hands and Last Supper.

On Wednesday our Year 6 students drew us into the events leading up to Christ's suffering and Crucifixion and the scene at the Tomb when all hope seemed lost. On Thursday, led by Year 4 we celebrated the great feast of the Resurrection of Jesus – The Pascal feast of Easter which the Church celebrates the Sunday after next.

During the week the children and parents have also had an opportunity to reflect on the Scriptural Stations of the Cross and the Garden of Gethsemane led by Year 5 students. One of the outstanding aspects of this was the questions posed by the students after enacting their particular station. These questions challenged us to think about how the particular event calls us to act in our lives and how does it help us to love our neighbour more.

At the heart of our faith story are the events of Christ's ministry – His life, death, and resurrection. During this time of the year we are led to contemplate once again that Jesus was both a person and at the same time divine. As a community of faith we walk with Christ and one another through the triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday to the bitter agony on the cross and to the empty tomb and the joyful resurrection of

The great HOPE of Easter is that after the darkness, confusion and desolation LOVE, LIGHT and LIFE prevails.


Easter Sunday. We walk not in great strides during this week but in small steps, passing through each movement mindful that we will reach the Resurrection and that just like our own life we will be forever transformed by the journey.

Why do the emotionally charged events of Holy Week and Easter resonate so strongly within us?

Perhaps it is because we can personally relate with the humanity of Christ's own experience. In our personal struggles, doubts, missteps, losses and challenges we, in essence, share in His Passion. The great hope of Easter is that after the darkness, confusion and desolation love, light and life prevail.



Bystanders & Good Samaritans

At a recent school assembly the students viewed a short animated video to help them learn how to be a safe and supportive bystander if they see bullying happening. This was the second video following an earlier one focussed on the definition of Bullying as opposed to Conflict.

The following information is a summary of the information presented:

Bullying & Bystanders

Bullying is when someone uses 'power' they have over someone else to try to hurt or upset them again and again. The people who see bullying are called bystanders. Anyone can be a bystander – children, parents, teachers and other people around. Some bystanders do things that make the bullying continue. They might join in or cheer someone on. Or they might do nothing and just watch.

Supportive Bystanders

Supportive bystanders use their power to try and stop the bullying. This could be defending or helping the person being bullied. Most people don't like to see bullying happening. But you might feel worried about what you can do. You can be worried that you might make it worse. Or maybe you think someone else should do something. Maybe you just don't know what to do. Maybe you're afraid about getting hurt yourself or being the next person to get bullied.

You do need to stay safe. The best way to be safe is being part of a group. Together, the group can make it clear that the bullying is not okay. That's really powerful!

What can Good Bystanders Do?

Bystanders always have ways to use their power for good. If you feel safe to do so, you can stand up to the bullying.

- You can say 'just stop it' in a cool and casual way.
- You can say something to distract everyone, like 'hey, don't we have to go practise for the game?'
- You can reduce the tension, saying something general like, 'let's try to keep things friendly here hey? No one likes that.'
- You can challenge the bullying by saying something like 'this isn't fair, let's all leave.' (and make sure you take the person being bullied along with you).

If you don't feel safe to stand up to the bullying, you can still help.

- You can walk away, leave the space or chat room. That way you don't provide an audience for the person doing the bullying.

Definitely don't join in.

Drama Literacy

This program will continue this year and is jointly facilitated by a trained actor and STA teachers. The drama-literacy program will focus for the first half of the year in Year 4. The intent of this program is to connect the English and Drama curriculum using texts as stimulus. At the same time, the Drama-Literacy program provides teachers with in-house professional learning in the use of specific high-yield learning strategies. Our students and teachers have benefited greatly from this initiative for many years and we are grateful to Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta for this resource.

Wakakirri & Visit by Deng Adut to STA

The story of Deng Adut will feature in the school's **Wakakirri Story Dance** item later this year. School rehearsals have recently commenced for this production. In 2012 St Thomas Aquinas won the Wakakirri Sydney Grandfinal in Division 1 with a production called, *Keep on Believing* based on the life of the Chinese-Australian author and dancer Li Cunxin also the subject of the film Mao's Last Dancer. In 2015 the school once again reached the grandfinal of Wakakirri with its interpretation of the children's book, *A Bus Called Heaven* which also received the Art Story Award.
