Dear St Thomas Aquinas Families,


Last Wednesday we began our Lenten journey for 2017 by receiving the Ashes with a most reverent, prayerful and beautiful liturgy with many families in attendance.

The ashes with which we are marked on Ash Wednesday symbolise our beginning and our ending and challenge us to translate our intentions and prayers into real deeds of sacrifice, faith and generosity during this 40-day season.

The Lenten period provides us a great opportunity to renew and deepen our relationship with God by stripping away some of the clutter in our spiritual lives. We can do this by emulating the example of Christ - by fasting, almsgiving and praying.

During the liturgy I spoke to the students about the notion of "Jubilee" that was mentioned in our opening song, "This is the Time".

What does Jubilee mean?



Lent, a time:

- * to stop
- * for new beginnings
- * for building bridges
- * to forgive each other
- ✤ to heal
- ✤ to share
- * for joyful giving
- * for celebration
- * to journey home again

The word Jubilee comes from the Jewish word meaning the curved horn of the ram. This was the instrument that was used to sound the beginning of the holy year of jubilee. The people of ancient times followed the law, which stated that the seventh day, the Sabbath, was set aside for rest, family and for God.

The Jubilee year followed this pattern of seven. The Jubilee year meant that every seven years farmers were expected to let their land rest from planting and to leave the fruits of the land for strangers and the poor to use. The idea was also to allow the soil to recover. It was a practical way to respect nature and to let the land recuperate and remain healthy. The people of this time believed that the land was from God and it was their responsibility to look after it for others, not just to use it.

The other aspect of Jubilee was that after seven cycles of seven years – that is, during the 50th year, other things took place. During this year of Jubilee it was ordained that God forgave everyone's sins. In order to gain God's pardon you in turn had to forgive others for their mistakes and wrong doings. Also during this Year of God's Favour everyone who had debts or owed money to others was released from that debt and could start over again. Slaves were released and went back to their families. People would be given back land that may have been taken away from them in the past.

Jubilee Today

We use this idea of Jubilee during the season of Lent to remind us that Lent is a time when we are asked to stop, open our hearts to others, to forgive others, be kind and generous to others particularly those in need. In doing these things we journey back home to Jesus who loves us without fail and forgives us without question.

NSW Australian of the Year Deng Adut Visit to STA

Our school hosted a visit from Deng Adut today. Deng, a former Sudanese Refugee, was named NSW Australian of the Year earlier this year. Deng is now a qualified lawyer graduating from Western Sydney University after arriving in Australia as a refugee in 1998.

Deng's story will feature in our Wakakirri Story Dance item later this year. In-school auditions are currently taking place to cast for this

production. It is hoped that Deng's visit will provide our students in Grades 4-6 with further inspiration and knowledge to portray Deng's amazing story with accuracy and empathy.

The process of choosing our new Student Representative Council has involved students in Years 5 and 6 with the guidance of their teachers and the Holy Spirit. In being selected to serve on the SRC these students have shown by their example, personal qualities and humility characteristics we believe typifies servant leadership.

Servant Leadership

On Friday our Year 6 students will host a visit from Rio Paralympian and former V8 Supercar driver, Colin Sieders. Colin took up canoeing (Paracanoe) after he was no longer able to race V8 Supercars due to a second motor vehicle accident in 2011.

In 1997, as a teenager he was involved in a car accident on his way to soccer when the car he was travelling in lost control and crashed. Colin spent months in intensive care and underwent numerous operations. Unable to continue driving after his second accident in 2011, Colin took up kayaking and last year was named in the Australian Paralympic Paracanoe team.

Colin is also a member of our community, his daughter Rosie is a student in Year 1 at STA.
