# **Principal's Morning Tea for Effort in Learning**

On Thursday 22 June we hosted the second morning tea in Term 2 for students who have demonstrated commitment and effort to their learning. The morning tea is intended as a simple way to celebrate and

It is always a privilege to listen to the reflections and I'm always impressed by their clarity and honesty.

This conversation with the students reminded me of Albert Einstein who once said that he did not believe that he was that smart, but he did believe that he was passionately curious. This curiosity is at the heart of all good learning. Our collective job is to model, encourage and foster this spirit of curiosity. Curiosity sparks imagination and creative thinking. Being curious hinges to a great extent on active listening and asking better questions rather than jumping straight to conclusions.

Learning often involves a large amount of trial and error as well as conceptual reasoning and visualisation. Einstein made numerous discoveries that his more technically able colleagues missed due largely to the fact that his persistence and curiosity led him to make more mistakes and to learn from these. **Congratulations and well done** to the following:

Yesterday we held a special assembly to acknowledge all those who worked in support of the Walkathon in particular the many students and their families who were able to contribute to the cause through their




