Dear St Thomas Aquinas Families,

Every year, each school in our Diocese develops annual school action plans focusing on the areas of Religious Education, Numeracy and Literacy. These plans identify specific student learning goals and determine professional learning for teachers for the year.

Our Learning Goal in Literacy for 2017 & 2018 is:

All students will improve the quality of their writing with a focus on text cohesion and spelling.



The Writing Process

One of the whole-school practices in this area is for each student in the school is to engage in the writing process every day. For students this may mean using their own imaginative drawings to spark their writing; for others a motivating event or a piece of literature that serves as an exemplar to stimulate writing. Sometimes students self-select a topic and write whatever comes to mind. Other times they choose from a list of writing prompts and

carry on from there. Occasionally, their writing continues for two or three days and develops into a full fiction or non-fiction story.

The pieces created during daily writing provide teachers with information about a child's comprehension, text cohesion, vocabulary, and various skills as a writer. They provide great content for writing conferences. Often, student writers select a piece to "polish up" to a published product.

Our Term 4 Writing Initiative

In support of our school goal on Writing we commenced this term with a whole school initiative using "shoes" as a common writing stimulus. The process was as follows:

Week 1: The Mysterious Shoe Caper

- Tuesday: Teachers in all classes wore odd shoes to class. This provoked a range of responses from the children.
- At the school assembly that day the students sang a specially composed "shoe song" to further promote curiosity and fun.
- On returning to their classes after assembly the students observed a shoe placed in their room.
- Wednesday: The students used the shoe in their class as inspiration for writing.
- Thursday: The class shoe went missing. The children again wrote about what might have happened to the shoe as inspiration.
- Friday: The same shoe reappeared in the classroom. The shoe now had been transformed and decorated.
- The children wrote again using the transformed shoe as inspiration.

Week 2: Making their Writing Better

Students selected a piece of writing from Week 1 to develop further. During this week the focus was on "making it better" and also focusing on text cohesion. The goal for each student in the school was to produce a published text by the end of Week 3. Grades were asked to set realistic text lengths for their particular grade, e.g. Year 2 - one paragraph, Year 6 three paragraphs and each a different text type.


Week 3: Proof Reading

Parents were invited to come into classrooms and help with final proofreading. Parents were also encouraged to talk to their children at home about their writing to assist the writing process. Each writing piece was published and reviewed by the Editor in Chief (teacher). The published piece of writing was placed on display in the school hall in readiness for the Publication Celebration Week in Week 4. The class stimulus shoe was also displayed with the students' writing.

Week 4: Publication Celebration Week

The hall was opened before and after school for students to share their writing with their parents and families. It was truly a celebration of each child's hard work and writing abilities. We are very proud of our students and their achievements in this area and look forward to future Publication Celebrations.

Perhaps amongst these budding student writers are the future Morris Gleitzmans, Emily Roddas, Anthony Horrowitzs, J.K. Rowlings and Roald Dahls of our world.

School Opal Card – Application Information

2018 Applications are now open. The application process has been simplified so that a new or updated application for school travel passes is only needed when a student is: **applying for** a school travel pass <u>for</u> <u>the first time</u>; requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (eg joint custody); **changing school** or campus; **changing home address**; receiving an **expiry** notification;



repeating a school year; changing their name or requesting a new transport operator. This means <u>students</u> who are <u>progressing to Year 3 and Year 7 only need to reapply if they are changing circumstances.</u> To apply or update your child's details visit www.transportnsw.info/school-students. This will be held next Thursday, 9 November at 7.30pm in our school hall.


Week 7 Band Assembly
